IMPORTANT - APPLICATION, CONTRACT AND PLACE

Submitting the registration form is a binding application, but no payment is made through the form and no place is confirmed at that moment. The participation contract is concluded only when Seven League accepts the application in writing and the required initial payment has been received or validly credited. Final League launch remains conditional on the minimum team and facility requirements in this Notice.

PERSONAL RESPONSIBILITY OF INFORMAL TEAMS

Unless Seven League expressly accepts a company, club or other legal entity as the Contracting Party in writing, the adult Team Representative who submits the form applies and contracts in their own name and is personally responsible for the Team fee and contractual obligations.

1. Status, parties and electronic acceptance

1.1 Purpose and scope

This Participation Notice & Financial Conditions (the "Notice") governs applications and participation by teams in Seven League Basel, the Open Football 7 competition for Season 2026/27. It sets the contractual, financial and key operational conditions that apply in addition to the Official League Rules & Regulations 2026/27 (the "Rules") and the Seven League Privacy Notice.

This Notice applies to an Open League team even where Seven League later places compatible Open and Corporate teams in one combined sporting competition. The Open Team fee and obligations in this Notice remain unchanged unless the Contracting Party expressly accepts a different written offer.

1.2 Organizer

The organizer is Seven League (Verein), Dornacherstrasse 324, 4053 Basel, Switzerland (the "Organizer" or "Seven League"). Seven League may act through its board members, competition manager, referees, venue partners, volunteers and authorized service providers.

1.3 Applicant, Contracting Party and Team Representative

The person submitting the registration form is the "Team Representative" and the applicant. The "Team" is the sporting group entered under the submitted team name.

Unless Seven League confirms in writing that a named company, club, association or other legal entity is the Contracting Party, the Team Representative is the Contracting Party personally. Private arrangements under which players contribute money do not divide, transfer or reduce that responsibility.

The Team Representative confirms that they are at least 18 years old and authorized to submit the application, receive official notices, supply team information and communicate competition decisions to the Team. The applicant must provide complete and accurate information and promptly correct any error or change.

1.4 Electronic application and formation of the contract

- Submitting the online form with the required acceptance boxes constitutes a binding application on the terms and document versions presented with the form.
- Seven League may review, accept, reject or request clarification of the application. An automated confirmation of receipt is not acceptance.
- No payment is collected through the form. Seven League will send the selected payment instructions and invoice separately by email after review.
- The participation contract is concluded when Seven League sends written acceptance and the required initial payment is received or validly credited, unless Seven League expressly confirms another formation date in writing.
- A confirmed place in the launched competition exists only after Seven League issues the League Confirmation Notice. Until then, any accepted Team has a conditional place.

1.5 Contract documents and priority

The participation contract consists of this Notice, the accepted registration data and selected payment plan, the Rules, the Privacy Notice, the League Confirmation Notice, the official calendar and any written variation accepted by both parties.

If documents conflict, mandatory law applies first, followed by this Notice for contractual and financial matters, the Rules for sporting and disciplinary matters, and then the official calendar and other administrative information. Mandatory venue, referee and emergency instructions prevail for immediate on-site safety matters.

NO MEMBERSHIP OR EMPLOYMENT

Participation does not make the Team, the Contracting Party, players, officials or spectators members, partners, agents or employees of Seven League.

2. Entry, launch and competition structure

2.1 Registration deadline and completion requirements

The standard team registration deadline is 15 August 2026. Seven League may extend the deadline or accept a late application where capacity, scheduling and sporting fairness allow. By the applicable deadline, a Team

must have submitted the required information, accepted the applicable documents, paid the required initial amount or obtained written confirmation of a Summer Cup credit, and completed any additional identity, badge or rights check requested by Seven League.

2.2 Minimum teams and launch decision

The League will launch only if at least ten teams complete the required registration and reservation steps and sufficient suitable facilities are available. The intended launch decision date is 31 August 2026. Seven League may communicate an earlier decision or a justified extension.

If the minimum or facility requirement is not met, Seven League may extend registration, offer a suitable alternative division or combined competition, postpone the launch or cancel the League. The refund provisions in Section 5 apply.

2.3 Categories, divisions and final format

A separate Open League and Corporate League will be created only where each category reaches at least ten confirmed teams and the available facilities support separate competitions. Otherwise Seven League may combine compatible teams in one competition. There is no fixed overall maximum number of teams, and multiple divisions, groups or parallel competitions may be created according to demand, level, capacity and sporting balance.

2.4 Season format and match programme

Season 2026/27 is planned as a league-and-cup competition. Each Team will be scheduled for at least 22 official competitive fixtures. The intended programme is 22 to 25 official matches per Team, but the final format may provide more than 25. A fixture awarded by forfeit remains an official fixture. No replacement match is owed where the Team is responsible for the fixture not being played under the Notice or Rules.

2.5 Calendar, match window and venues

- Standard season period: September 2026 to June 2027.
- Regular match window: weekdays, normally between 17:00 and 22:00.
- Venues: fields approved by Seven League in Basel or the surrounding Basel area.
- The official calendar will confirm the exact season dates, match weeks, breaks, cup rounds, transfer window, venues and fixtures.

A Team is not guaranteed a particular weekday, kick-off time, venue, opponent, division or stand-alone category. Published fixtures are binding. Private changes between teams have no effect unless Seven League confirms them in writing.

2.6 Operational changes

Seven League may make proportionate changes to dates, venues, divisions, opponents, match sequence or format because of registrations, facility availability, weather, safety, official restrictions, team withdrawals, referee availability, force majeure or another material operational reason. Seven League will make reasonable efforts to preserve the core sporting value, a comparable programme and fair competition.

3. Season fee, invoices and payment plans

3.1 Fee summary

Total season fee	CHF 2,300 per Team
Reservation component	CHF 300, deducted from the total fee
Remaining balance after reservation	CHF 2,000
Currency and method	Swiss francs by bank transfer to the account stated on the invoice

The fee applies to the Team's Open entry and remains the same if the sporting competition is combined with another category, unless the Contracting Party expressly accepts a different written offer.

3.2 Selected payment plan

The plan selected in the registration form determines the invoice schedule. The initial invoice and subsequent invoices will identify the Team, amount, due date and payment reference.

Plan 1 - Reservation + single balance	CHF 300	CHF 2,000	Reservation: within 5 days of invoice and by the registration deadline. Balance: within 10 days after League Confirmation and before the first fixture.
Plan 2 - Reservation + two instalments	CHF 300	CHF 1,000 + CHF 1,000	Reservation as above. First instalment: within 10 days after League Confirmation and before the first fixture. Second instalment: 15 January 2027.
Plan 3 - Full season payment	CHF 2,300	None	Within 5 days of invoice and by the registration deadline, unless the invoice gives a later written date.

3.3 Manual invoice and bank transfer

No payment is made through the registration form. After reviewing the application, Seven League will email the invoice and bank-transfer instructions to the registered Team Representative. Payments must quote the Team or invoice reference. Bank charges and currency-conversion costs are borne by the payer. Cash is valid only where Seven League expressly agrees and issues a written receipt.

3.4 Summer Cup credit

Where the same Team or Contracting Party has paid CHF 300 for the Seven League Summer Cup 2026, Seven League will credit that amount as the League reservation once confirmed in writing. No second CHF 300 reservation is payable. The credit satisfies the reservation component but does not reduce the total season fee below CHF 2,300 and is not transferable without written approval.

3.5 Late or missing payment

Seven League may release a conditional place where the initial invoice is not paid on time. For another overdue amount, Seven League may issue a written reminder and a ten-calendar-day cure period. Statutory default interest may accrue. After the cure period, Seven League may suspend player registration or fixtures, apply a forfeit where the Rules allow, refuse continued participation or terminate the contract. Sporting sanctions do not cancel amounts contractually due.

3.6 No unilateral deduction or set-off

The Contracting Party may not withhold or reduce a payment because of a sporting disagreement, protest or claim unless Seven League accepts the deduction in writing or a competent authority finally determines it.

4. Services included and costs not included

4.1 Included in the season fee

- Entry of one Team into the confirmed league-and-cup competition.
- Competition administration, scheduling and ordinary official communications.
- Standard hire of approved fields for official fixtures.
- Assignment of a referee for official fixtures.
- Team and player registration administration.
- Recording and publication of fixtures, results and standings.
- Ordinary competition statistics, disciplinary administration, trophies and awards where announced.

4.2 Not included

- Personal accident, health, disability, liability, travel, loss-of-income or personal-property insurance.
- Travel, parking, food or accommodation.
- Playing kit, footwear, shin guards, match balls or other Team equipment.
- Disciplinary fines, appeal or protest deposits, property damage or exceptional costs caused by the Team.
- Bank charges, currency-conversion costs, training sessions, friendly matches or additional field bookings.
- Optional recording, media, merchandise, sponsorship or another service not expressly included in writing.

The home Team must provide at least one suitable size 5 match ball in good condition, as stated in the Rules.

5. Withdrawal, cancellation and refunds

5.1 Team withdrawal before League Confirmation

If the Team voluntarily withdraws before the League Confirmation Notice, the CHF 300 reservation is normally non-refundable. It compensates Seven League for administration, planning and the reserved place. Seven League may waive or reduce this consequence where exceptional circumstances make that fair.

5.2 Team withdrawal after League Confirmation

After League Confirmation, Seven League commits fields, referees and other resources in reliance on the Team. The full season fee therefore remains due if the Team withdraws, does not complete registration or stops playing. Seven League will credit costs it actually avoids or amounts it recovers by filling the place with a replacement Team, less the CHF 300 reservation and reasonable non-recoverable costs. Sporting consequences under the Rules apply separately.

5.3 Minimum not reached

If Seven League does not launch a suitable League because the minimum number of teams or sufficient facilities are not available, League reservation and other League payments received will be refunded within 14 calendar days after the cancellation notice, without interest.

5.4 Summer Cup credit exception

A Summer Cup payment already used for an event that took place is not refunded merely because its CHF 300 value was later recognized as a League reservation credit and the League is not launched. The Team already received the Summer Cup service. Separate Summer Cup cancellation terms apply if that event itself is cancelled.

5.5 Organizer cancellation before the first match

If Seven League cancels the confirmed League before the first match for a reason not caused by the Team, League payments received will be refunded, without prejudice to rights that cannot lawfully be excluded.

5.6 Interruption after the season starts

If the League cannot reasonably be completed after it starts, Seven League will first seek a lawful and sportingly fair solution, such as rescheduling, changing venue, shortening the calendar or adjusting the format. If permanent cancellation is unavoidable, Seven League will calculate a fair refund for the undelivered portion after considering matches and services delivered and reasonable non-recoverable third-party costs. The calculation will be explained to affected teams.

5.7 No automatic refund for proportionate changes or Team fault

A proportionate change of venue, date, kick-off time, division, opponent, format or match sequence does not by itself create a refund right where Seven League continues to provide the core competition service. No refund is due for forfeits, suspensions, exclusion or inability to play where responsibility rests with the Team under this Notice or the Rules.

HOW TO WITHDRAW

A withdrawal must be sent by the registered Team Representative through the official contact channel. It takes effect only when Seven League confirms receipt in writing.

6. Team, representative and participant obligations

6.1 Team Representative

- Keep the Team, billing and contact information accurate and current.
- Monitor official communications and relay fixtures, changes, suspensions and decisions to the Team.
- Maintain the player roster and ensure that only registered and eligible players participate.
- Provide the Rules and relevant notices to players, officials and any person whose data is submitted.
- Ensure timely arrival, appropriate equipment and compliance with venue, referee and emergency instructions.
- Cooperate with identity checks, incident investigations and an orderly withdrawal or replacement process.
- Remain responsible for Team payments even where players contribute privately.

6.2 Player eligibility

Every player must be registered and approved before participating and must comply with the Rules, including the one-team rule, suspension status and identity checks. Players are normally at least 18 years old. A player aged 16 or 17 may participate only with Seven League's prior written approval, parent or legal-guardian confirmation, suitable insurance and any required safeguarding documentation. Players under 16 may not participate in the adult competition.

6.3 Conduct and Team responsibility

The Team, its players, substitutes, officials and associated spectators must act safely, honestly and respectfully. Violence, threats, intimidation, discrimination, harassment, abuse of referees, false identity, match manipulation, dangerous conduct and property damage are prohibited.

The Team is responsible within the competition process for conduct clearly associated with it before, during and after matches, including changing areas, venue grounds and official digital channels. The Team Representative must take reasonable steps to prevent, stop and report misconduct.

6.4 Sanctions, damage and outstanding amounts

Seven League may apply the sporting, disciplinary and financial measures stated in the Rules, including warnings, suspensions, forfeits, points deductions, spectator restrictions, exclusion and a disciplinary fine of up to CHF 500 per incident. Proven property damage, contractually due fees and unavoidable third-party costs are separate from that disciplinary-fine ceiling.

6.5 Team identity and third-party rights

The Team name, badge, shirts and promotional material must be lawful, non-discriminatory, non-obscene and not misleading. The Contracting Party warrants that it owns or has sufficient permission to use and supply any team, club, sponsor or third-party name, badge, logo or trademark. Seven League may require a change where an identity infringes rights, creates confusion or breaches the Rules.

7. Health, inherent sporting risk, insurance and liability

7.1 Inherent risk and fitness

Football involves contact, falls, collisions, physical exertion and other inherent risks. Participation is voluntary. Each participant must decide whether they are medically fit, follow professional medical advice, use appropriate equipment and stop playing when injured, ill, impaired or unsafe.

7.2 Insurance

Unless Seven League expressly confirms otherwise in writing, the season fee does not include personal accident, health, disability, loss-of-income, travel, personal-property or individual liability insurance. Each participant and the Contracting Party must verify that appropriate insurance applies to amateur football in Switzerland.

7.3 Emergency and safety instructions

Participants must follow the referee, venue and emergency instructions. Suspected concussion, serious injury, severe weather, unsafe facilities or loss of safe control may require a player's removal, suspension or abandonment of a match. Sporting convenience never takes priority over emergency care or safety.

7.4 Liability

Liability is governed by Swiss law. Nothing in this Notice excludes or limits liability for intent or gross negligence, death or personal injury where exclusion is prohibited, or another liability that cannot lawfully be excluded. Seven League is not an insurer and is not liable merely because an inherent sporting risk results in injury, damage or loss.

To the extent permitted by law, Seven League is not responsible for indirect or consequential loss, lost income, personal property, travel costs or losses caused by participants, spectators, third parties, weather, venue closure or another event outside its reasonable control. Any liability limitation is applied only to the extent lawful and proportionate in the circumstances.

PARTICIPANT RESPONSIBILITY

Each Team Representative must clearly inform players that personal accident and health coverage is not included and that participation is at the player's own decision as to fitness and insurance.

8. Personal data, statistics, photography and media

8.1 Privacy Notice

Seven League processes registration, contact, eligibility, payment, match, disciplinary, safety, technical and statistical data in accordance with the Seven League Privacy Notice and applicable law. Acknowledging the Privacy Notice confirms that it has been read; it is not a blanket consent to every optional use.

The Team Representative must give each player direct access to the current Privacy Notice before submitting that player's data and must submit only information reasonably required for Team and competition administration.

8.2 Public competition records

As part of the competition service, Seven League may publish a registered player's name or approved display name, Team, appearances, goals, assists where tracked, cards, suspensions, standings and awards. A participant may request correction of an error or raise a substantiated safety or privacy concern under the Privacy Notice.

8.3 Player profile photographs

A player may participate without agreeing to a public profile photograph. Seven League will obtain and record the adult player's own affirmative choice before taking or publishing a profile portrait. The Team Representative does not consent on behalf of an adult player. A neutral silhouette, Team badge or other non-identifying placeholder may be used where the player does not agree.

8.4 Match, event and promotional media

Matches and events may be photographed or recorded, but recording is not guaranteed. Seven League will provide reasonable advance or on-site notice where planned recording is relevant. Identifiable portraits,

planned close-ups, highlights, full-match recordings and promotional content will be handled under the Privacy Notice and with the appropriate legal justification and consent where required. Participants may report a specific safety, safeguarding or privacy concern at any time.

8.5 Team names, badges and logos

The Contracting Party grants Seven League a non-exclusive, royalty-free licence for the term of the competition and reasonable historical archive to display the approved Team name, badge and sponsor marks in team profiles, fixtures, standings, results, awards and ordinary promotion of the competition. This does not transfer ownership. Broader commercial use requires a separate appropriate basis or agreement.

9. Communications, changes and general legal terms

9.1 Official communications

Communications sent to the registered Team Representative through the registered email address, the league platform or another channel designated by Seven League are communications to the Team. The Team must keep contact details current and monitor official messages. Failure to read a properly sent message does not normally invalidate it.

9.2 Force majeure and events outside reasonable control

Seven League is not in breach merely because performance is delayed, interrupted or reasonably adapted by weather, field closure, official order, safety risk, epidemic, transport disruption, utility failure, referee unavailability, serious incident or another event outside its reasonable control. Seven League will take reasonable steps to mitigate the effect and apply Section 5 where permanent cancellation becomes unavoidable.

9.3 Amendments

Seven League may correct an obvious error or ambiguity and may make a necessary in-season change because of law, safety, venue conditions, a governing-rule change or a serious operational need. A material change affecting an accepted Team will be communicated to the Team Representative and will not normally operate retroactively, except where required for safety, law or clarification of an existing obligation.

9.4 Language

The English version controls. A German, French, Spanish or other translation may be provided for convenience. If versions differ, the English wording prevails unless mandatory law requires otherwise.

9.5 Severability and no waiver

If a provision is invalid or cannot be applied, the remaining provisions continue. The invalid provision will be interpreted or replaced as closely as legally possible to its intended purpose. A delay or failure to enforce one right is not a general waiver of that or another right.

9.6 Applicable law and jurisdiction

Swiss law applies. The courts of Basel-Stadt have jurisdiction, subject to any mandatory place of jurisdiction or other non-excludable right under applicable law.

10. Electronic acceptance record

By submitting the Seven League Basel registration form and selecting the required acceptance boxes, the applicant confirms that:

- the submitted information and selected payment plan are accurate;
- they received, read and accept this Notice and the Official League Rules & Regulations 2026/27;
- they received and read the Seven League Privacy Notice;
- they understand that, unless Seven League accepts another legal entity in writing, they apply and contract personally and are responsible for the Team fee and obligations;

- they understand that no payment is made through the form and payment instructions will be sent separately by email;
- they understand that submission is an application and that participation is not confirmed until Seven League accepts the application, receives the required initial payment and issues the League Confirmation Notice; and
- they will provide the Rules and Privacy Notice to the Team's players and officials as required.
